## ‘Dirty Tricks' Laid iṑ Fiviv

- INDIANAPOLIS, Nov. 4 (UPI) - An aide to the director of the Veterans Administration and a former Indiana Republican State Committee chairman are among five men indicted for Watergate-style "dirty tricks" against the 1970 campaign of Sen. Vance Hartke (D-Ind.).
The five were named by a Marion County grand jury in sealed indictments handed down Friday. Names of the five surfaced Monday as one of them surrendered in Marion County Criminal Court. The other four are slated to surrender Wednesday.
