- 2. The Army-originated report (Inclosure 1) and the NIS Report containing Army-originated information (Inclosure 2) have been reviewed, determined to be releasable and are forwarded herewith. Those paragraphs of Inclosure 1, which have been sanitized under the provisions of 5 USC 552(b)(7)(C) contain information concerning persons other than yourself. Their identities are shown in the report but the information pertaining to them has been deleted. This information, if released to you without the authorization of the individuals concerned, would result in a clearly unwarranted invasion of the privacy rights of other individuals, and is exempt from the mandatory public disclosure requirement of the Freedom of Information Act.
- 3. The sanitizations which have been made in processing these records for release to you constitute a partial denial of your request by the properly designated Initial Denial Authority (IDA), and you are hereby advised of your right to appeal this partial denial to the Secretary of the Army. Town Hall Pally

On 18 February, the "National Guardian" sponsored a public meeting in New York City's Town Hall, featuring Mrs. Marguerite OSWALD, mother of Lee OSWALD and her lawyer, Mark LANE. About 1500 people were on hand to hear the opeakers profess OSWALD's innocence. LIME, who spoke first, played a talpe recording he said had been made by a Dallas school teacher who witnessed the assassination of President Kennedy. The woman said she heard shots chome from an over-mass ahead of the Presidents's ear. KXX LANE said this meant the fatal shots had not come from the warehouse in which police had placed OSWALD at the

The "National Guardian" was required to deposit \$25,000 in cash to cover possible damage to Town Hall premises. Objections were raised by James AARONSON, the newspaper's editor, who insisted that the usual rental fee of \$600 had been confirmed by a letter and check on 14 January, after arrangements had beem made by telephone. Town Hall officials insisted on the \$25,000 bond on the ground that Mts. OSWALD's appearance "cou,d be incendiary". The controversacy was settled when AARONSON deposited the money in negotiable bonds and cashier's checks in f bank against the Town Hall claims. AARONSON reportedly raised the money from four persons, but he did not give their name.
