The records of this Bureau reflect no information identifiable with General Donald A. Donaldson; however, during the investigation to locate Dimitroff in 1964, reference was made to a Donald Donaldson, who was born on February 10, 1931, at Winnipeg, Canada, and was known to the Los Angeles Office of Immigration and Naturalization Service under their number Al2594316. Records of the Denver, Colorado, FBI office reflect that Donald Donaldson was an alias of Dimitroff, who used that name in dealing with at least one of his victims in a fraudulent scheme.

Willem Leonard Oltmans, a Dutch television correspondent, is a well known "assassination buff" who since March of 1977, has appeared before the House Select Committee on Assassinations, talked to the press, and appeared on television, claiming knowledge of conspiracies against the life of President John F. Kennedy. According to Oltmans, one of his prime sources was George de Mohrenschildt. Oltmans claimed de Mohrenschildt was the middle man in a conspiricy of Texas oil men, headed by the late H. L. Hunt, and anti-Castro Cubans to kill Kennedy. On 3/29/77, de Mohrenschildt apparently committed suicide. On 9/8/77, Oltmans appeared on ABC's "Good Morning America" program. He then indicated he had a "new source" in the Kennedy assassination plot whom he identified as General Donald A. Donaldson, originally a Bulgarian called Deko Demetroff.
