Paul and Jim (Gary),

In the course of thinking about N.O. yesterday, in preparation for a visit from someone going there, I recalled previous correspondence on the Double-Chek Corp and FBI inquiry there re IHO. I know I wrote Moo about this at least once but didn't file that under D-C. I wrote you about this in a letter largely on other things 2/4/70.

This seems to me to be one of the less-easily avoided areas for Archives checking, if Jim hasn't done it or if you haven't. If you have explored this, I have no recollection of your telling me.

Citation, CE1911 (234712). I had checked the 1967 N.O. phone book and found no listing for it or Carol Amberg. I had no access to a city directory then. Or since. Carol Amberg may still be around.

The question remains, why would the FBI have assumed they should check IHO out with Double Chek, and then, to the best of our knowledge, only in N.O.? If we assume it a proper inquiry, given the known reports and rumors, how justify the absence of any known check in Dallas and Atlanta (del quit reports) and Miami (a number of them)? N.O. alone is inconsistent with the assumption this was just a blind check, therefore, the reason for this specific check might be interesting and should be sought.

The address, 2107 Banks, is not an office area. Banks is between Canal and Tulane end, I'd guess, on the Quarter side of Broad, which is the cross street where the DA's office is. Or, close to the Quarter and not one of the better residential areas, likely at least partly a business area. But this is just guessing. I never had time to check it out.
