A/CUBA - Request for assistance by former Cuban army officer

This report covers the visit of two Cuban nationals to the office of the Haral stacke.

- 1. Background. On 18 July, The Chief of the U.S. Naval Mission to Venezuela called the Haval Litache and said that two Gubans had approached him in an effort to obtain assistance in getting visas to the U.S. He stated that he had directed them to the office of the Raval Attache.

He stated that he was a former Cuban army Suptain in the Estista regime and had been a professional soldier - without politics. At that time he was given a "Salvoconducto" \$74,030-2 by the Venezuelan Ministry of Interior dated 15 July, 1950 and expiring 15 January 1961.

ZUMIZARRETA spoks almost no English and it appears that aRCACHA was accompanying him to aid in interpreting if necessary. He said that he feared for his life both in Venezusla and all possible extradition to Guba where he might be tried and executed although he claimed to he been guilty only of having been in the army in Batista's time.

3. Subsequent Visits. The next morning ZUBIZARESTA appeared with his papers partially fil out and requested assistance in completing them. This was done and he left.
