Subpoena Is Issued For Dulles

NEW ORLEANS, March 8 (UPI)—A judge today ordered former Central Intelligence Agency Director Allen Dulles to answer a subpoena in New Orleans March 28 and 29 in District Attorney Jim Garrison's investigation of the Kennedy assassination.

District Judge Matthew Braniff signed the order, which would grant Dulles immunity from prosecution, and instructed it be sent to his home in Washington.

Garrison subpoenaed Dulles on grounds he would be able to tell the Orleans Parish grand jury whether presidential assassin Lee Harvey Oswald was a CIA agent.

Garrison has contended that President Kennedy was assassinated by a band of right-wing adventurers with CIA ties, and that Oswald may not have been the assassin, but only a "pigeon" set up to take the blame.

Garrison has charged Clay

L. Shaw, former managing director of the New Orleans International Trade Mart, with conspiring to assassinate Mr. Kennedy in the months before the President was shot to death in Dallas Nov. 22, 1963.

Shaw is scheduled to go on trial some time this year. The Shaw case is currently bogged down in an involved hearing over defense requests that the trial be moved out of New Orleans.

District Judge Edward Haggerty Jr. halted the proceedings on the change of venue request this week to consider a request that every prospective juror in the parish jury wheel be called.

Assistant District Attorney Richard Burnes said today that as he understands the motion, Shaw's attorneys are asking not just to interview the jury wheel, but "all prospective jurors registered with the jury commission."

"This would be 10,000 to 12,000," Burnes said. "If they do that I want the hot dog concession in the hall."
