



THE MANY FACES of Charles Manson as he has appeared at various times during the Sharon Tate murder trial in Los Angeles (where he and his three girl co-defendants were convicted of the grisly slaughter): From left, the beginning, Dec. 24, 1969, when the judge gave him permission to act as his own attorney; Oct. 21, 1970; Nov. 2, 1970, for the first time with hair cut and neatly

The jury was still hearing testimony in the penalty phase of the trial, had last learned Manson also marked Sharon Tate's next-door neighbors for murder the same night but panic aborted the alleged "orders" to Susan Atkins, Charles Watson, Patricia Krenwinkel, Linda Kasabian, and the neighbors lived.
