Dear Paul,

An extraneous thought just occurred to me, so I write this brief note without checking it out further.

In CD 1349:14 deBrueys gives as his source on the rumor Fena was going to Moscow one Guillermo Antonio Fallio. However, in earlier reports, does he not assign a I number to him?

Now, unless this was just carelessness (assuming my recollection is correct), why was there any need to assign an informant number to Fallio to begin with?

Without deep thought, two things occur to me: Fallio is one of his regular informants of Cuban activities or there may be a special significance in his having been admitted to the US on immigrant status - or that this is exploited by the feds.

At least some of the INS people assumed added functions with respect to Cubans (In this report he quotes Dave Smith and I think Fena also mentioned his name to me). INS people regularly asked Fena to provide temporary accommodations to exiles as they arrived. Fena has a few rooms above the Habana (which is a double building, despite the singular street address) that he rents out regularly and it may also be true of the Greek Club, up the street, toward Iberville, and it may have been true at two other properties (for example, behind the Montmartre he has an apartment that Everisto used and probably space above it). Fena had a total of four properties in 5/67. I have not kept tabs. But last year he still had these three.
