Dear Mr. Lynch,

When you phoned yesterday I thought Jim was responding to my letter you did not receive. I wrote more than a week ago, I'm sure.

If when I have something I think Jim would want to know, I can send it to him here & there is a chance it can get lost in the waves of mail he receives. The address I have for me is 1907, 1936 Elizabeth Ave.

There was a legitimate reason for my reluctance to identify the witness I had interviewed recently. Until now he has had his interest require confidentiality. It may then be that my having interviewed him should not become public knowledge because he is subject to retaliation.

He has already been subjected to great pressure.

He is in the new book. I deliberately avoided writing another to interview him for it because the book did not require it and do his interest. However, because this book will attract some attention to him, I did send him a second draft. In a recent draft I believe Mr. Johnson required his statement of the content of this book be left out, probably to hide And before it appears.

It took him about a month to respond. I then told him that while I would like very much to interview him he need not feel compelled, it was not a precondition to his learning what was about to appear about him and that the sole precondition was confidentiality until the book is on sale.

He elected to talk to me.

I had prepared for him portions of all references to him and other matters I believe he should know. One of these was a letter by Leon Jaworski, attorney for whom was the purpose of your call. It is on Jaworski in the book.

Because this is one of the very few we whom will be able to afford to meet Jaworski, you and he will then know AND I am not being specific.

I wish I knew where this will be taken from, from which newspaper or magazine, but I am sure it is a special circumstance. I hope that Jaworski, even with very non-confidential book, will however not discuss this with anyone outside of the possible circumstances the Congress would consider an exemption under the Freedom of Information Act that on his first legislative visit Ford succeeded in having classified nothing the sources into a provision to suppress. He and Ford accomplished this by a amendment at the conference level, Orwell for "open administration."

You will find other hot Ford content in this book.

As of now I have no way of distributing it in the Bay area. The California distributor of my earlier books has dropped me out of something over \$5,000 so I can't see him. If Jim knows an honest distributor, I sure would like to hear from him.

In not identifying this man and not wanting to say publicly that I have interviewed him I am not being coy. Jim should remember a half-dozen occasions on another occasion when I spoke to witnesses off the air in their interest even though they were not reluctant to speak publicly. One, who was not a source on assassination information, might have been killed over what he gave me. He was a minor official of one of the more extreme of the extremist groups. In the end he gave me all their most secret material, in volume a stack of papers maybe four inches thick. Those of the past were swinging above!
