For the first time there is an interest in subsidiary rights. Until I have the answer this means I've offered an initial exclusive. If it comes to pass, and the odds do not have me running out to buy a new lambswool or even a steak, there will be much left.

So, I'm writing to tell you, to let you know that when I have a copy I'll send one to you, perhaps with a build date, because I do think it is one you'll want to read before you say anything.

I'll have no California distributor unless someone can help me with a distributor who is not a crook. The one who handled the other books beat me heavily. Even the Elder operation did, as Mal Hart may remember from taking me there a couple of times to solicit, each time with a promise made and not kept.

In fact, there is but a single distributor I know I'll be able to find, in N.Y. And the other major ones owe me money and there is no point in giving them more they'll not pay for.

I was in NYC last week. There where I visited for a while with the one man who really tried for me. He told me what he probably can't prove, that he is certain that there is a concerted federal effort to keep me from being published. This was from his experience. And with the book that turned the May case over. (There was a preliminary hearing on it today, on discovery motions for the evidentiary hearing. I was to have been there but decided instead to do what remains to be done on this newest work.)

A younger colleague has borrowed the money to pay the printer.

Because of one special aspect we feel we must give each member of Congress a copy. Or, 535 fractions plus the cost of getting them out to begin with.

Do you know that the House has named the Committee on Information to look into it? It is before the House - Nixon must be mad at the House for not doing it. I am not.

I do think you will find much in this new book. I'm at teleworking most of the time so I can't read books, but should get the full flavor of the movement.

Know the book is anything else. Then a 61-year-old is the one investigator, writer, editor (7), publisher, distributor, promoter, mail-order dept and assistant counsel he has little time. (Thank God my wife is the world's best typist! She is also my equivalent of typesetter.) I'm having to try to get six hours' sleep these nights and that shortens the day more.

Sorry I'll not be able to travel with this. No money. Also other work. On the Ray case and a long book started in April and then titled The Unimpeachment of Richard Nixon. Draft almost completed. Were it not for this work it would be done and the editing started. No developments mean any changes. Which is howling! Much now in it, too. And no rehashing of what is not new. It is put together as it never has been. I must finish it and look for a publisher. And once tax season starts, I'll have no typist. It is the one time of the year we have income, by wife's.

But I do wish I could get out there again. If only for "hallow."
