12/18/67

Sunday night I attended Lands Eichhund's discussion group. That man over at Landau was a dozen people. It ran rather late, until 11:30 p.m. only because over Arnold's objections, his guests, especially Abram Schulteck, symphony violinist, insisted that O talk about the opposition & your investigation (I had to wait until 7 p.m. not less than 3 1/2 hours earlier). Harry Thonley is well known to those people - see my earlier memo on how to handle, with whom Thonley now lives)

Thonley apparently lived under fascism in Poland & barely escaped. One Jack Barnside also mentioned Thonley is a man I took to indicate he might have known him well. Lands is seemingly intelligent. He is pleasant and articulate & has quite opinions. He can be persistently boring in discussion, firmly insisting on non-separatism. He has 2 young children & a young, pleasant wife. His is a large, high-ceilinged ~~home~~ house from which large posters of plaster are missing from the ceiling of the living room. It is also poorly kept.

One of the late arrivals was Sandra Brown, Dyer tall, slim, aggressive, mini-mini-skirted wife. Sandra is in college, will soon be qualified to teach English-Spanish). She is sensitive, articulate, expressive, & inclined to help her expression with her hands. She was quietly intense, spoke more than the other women together, & very intelligently to the point.

None of these people were books. None displayed any racist-right tendencies, none used or thought in any of the racist-right clichés. There were no political (in the sense of party or spectrum) discussions or positions. The general tone was ~~one of~~ one of political liberality, as, for example, one now questions which is where the discussion began, after the P. B. L. broadcast on that, within the evening all of it was serious, mature & reasonable.
