Dear Mr. Moschella,

Thanks for your 10/6 and the enclosed three records relating to Alexander Eist. I hope to be able to return to that book and history is to be served.

There should be other Eist records. He reached the House assassins via the FBI, these records quote him as saying that he reported the fictions to which he later testified so an inquiry of New Scotland Yard is expectable, with its response, and then there was the commotion of his testimony.

The atborney general did find the King assassination investigation to be a subject of such interest as to make it historical, calling for what he promised, maximum possible public disclosure. So I hope the other Eist records will be disclosed.

I'm pleased that you remember that there was an agreement between the FBI and me, as you put it, for me to get copies of records disclosed to others. Hawever, that agreement was not limited to the FBIHQ Murkin file. The FBI then agreed to send me copies of all records on the investigation and on the assassination of Dr. King. There are relevant records not filed under MURKIN.

I've heard, by the way, that Eist is dead.
