



Dear Friend,

We are asking for your support and help in organizing an emergency march and rally in Boston on Saturday, December 14 in response to brutal attacks against black school children.

We feel you share our outrage at this recent violence and believe that black children have the right to attend any school in safety.

Several years ago racist attacks in Birmingham and Selma, Alabama, became a focus of national attention and the civil rights movement was responsible for turning the situation around. Today Boston is the test-case city. The racists have gained confidence because as yet there has been no massive outcry against their attacks. Similarly, in other cities across the country reactionary attempts to overturn school integration plans are now being fueled by inaction in Boston. This will continue unless we act now.

The Freedom March for Human Dignity will be a peaceful demonstration of deep concern involving thousands of civil rights advocates from all walks of life and all parts of the country.

As Massachusetts State Senator-elect William Owens declared in announcing plans for the march, "Let our voices and our presence say NO to institutionalized racism! NO to racist mob violence! NO to racism in education!"

Supporters of civil liberties know that campaigns of this scope necessitate substantial fund-raising efforts. Funds are needed immediately for newspaper ads; bus and train transportation; hundreds of thousands of leaflets, posters, buttons; rent, phone bills, and mailings.

Your generous contribution today can help make this vital response to the forces of reaction a reality on December 14.
