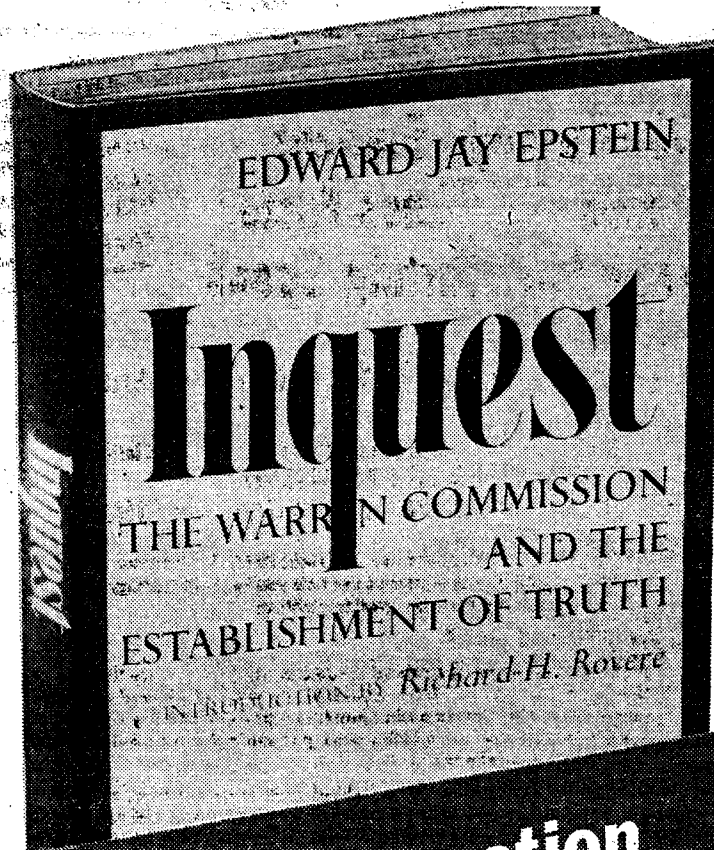

Did a second killer join Lee Harvey Oswald in the assassination of John F. Kennedy? The total body of evidence seemingly substantiates an answer of "no." But the question has been freshly — and quite respectably — raised by a 30-year-old Harvard graduate student who has dug into the voluminous files of the Warren Commission to uncover facts and hypotheses either missed or glossed over by the distinguished commissioners.

The new researcher into the assassination records is Edward Jay Epstein, now a candidate for a Ph.D. in government and author of "Inquest — The Warren Commission and the Establishment of Truth," to be published June 29 by Viking Press. Epstein raises three questions about:

- The "dominant purpose" of the Warren Commission — was it established primarily to determine the truth, or to settle doubts and suspicions?
- The possibility of the "second assassin" — does available evidence question the conclusion that Oswald did all the shooting?
