NOTE: Bufiles contain no information definitely identifiable with correspondent; however, a person of this same name with a Salt Lake City address was on the mailing list in 1942. The book to which correspondent refers has been reviewed at the Bureau and it attempts to establish a second assassin was involved and bases this theory on the time sequence of shots fired and the official autopsy report. Epstein's research was obviously superficial since it is reported he spent only two days reviewing material at the National Archives and he has obviously distorted facts to fit his theory.
