

Warren Commission probed FBI ties to JFK killer, records show

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WASHINGTON — The Warren Commission dismissed a report that Lee Harvey Oswald was working for the Federal Bureau of Investigation when he allegedly assassinated President Kennedy, a recently declassified transcript reveals.

I. Lee Rankin, general counsel of the commission, said he had been told by Waggoner Carr, Texas attorney general, that "the word had come out . . . that Oswald was acting as an FBI undercover agent."

Rankin said he was told that Oswald's badge cover agent, number was 179 and that Oswald was paid \$200 a month from September 1962 until the assassination.

Members of the commission, including the late Chief Justice Earl Warren and President Ford, when a Michigan congressman discussed the allegation at a closed meeting on Jan. 22, 1964.

The transcript of the session was classified top secret for 11 years. It was released to Harold Weisberg, an author who filed suit to obtain the document.

Weisberg's books and articles criticize the commission's investigation and its conclusion that Oswald acted alone in killing Kennedy.

The transcript of the meeting revealed the following:

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Rankin also said he was told that a journalist originated the report.

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An unidentified speaker, "But the FBI get people to do things . . . or, possibly, Warren, said. "Why are they so eager to make both of those conclusions . . .?"

The members also discussed their fear that the assassin . . . and cussed their fear that the FBI was trying to maneuver them into endorsing the bureau's investigations.

An unidentified speaker said, "They (the FBI) would like to have us fold up and quit." The discussion ended with several commissioners suggesting that the record of the meeting be destroyed.
