## MEMORANDUM FOR ER. TOLSON Min. DL LOACH MR. ROSEN

This morning the Attorney General called at my effice and during the course of the conference, he referred in some detail to the plane for the removal of James Larf day from Great Britain to Memphic, Tennessee.

He told me that he had been adviced that we were going to have four Agents accompany May. I told him it was my understanding that there would be three and and an Air Force physician. The Attorney General told me that he understood that we would deliver hay to the baselff of sacity County, Tennessee, and begained whether that would be done at the sirport or at the Snelby County Jail. I told him that I had instented my coolic that the transfer to the custody of the bineriff of thelby Count, Lo concummated at the Naval Airport as soon as the plane from Great in Rain touched down and that from there on, the recurity and custody of Day was the responsibility of the Sheriff of Shelby County. The Attorney General empressed scale concern as to what might happen to May on route from the airport to the shelly County Joll. He asked that this bureau keep in touch with the situation so as to know of any intelligence that would be of value in preventing any overt set a kinst Pay even after he is placed in the custody of the bheriff of thelby county at the nirport.

I told him I understood that be, the Astorney General, and already ment representatives of the Prison Lureau to Memphia to Inspect the jail and that they had and had Indicated that it was secure. The Attorney General stated that he would prefer to have the PBI check the proposed arrangements at the joil and advise hir: of its becurity. Please see that immediate telephonic instructions are issued to the SAC at Men phis to contact the cheriff of Shelby County and ascertain just exactly what his plans are for the incarceration of May and the security of the same. Our Agent in Charge should also ascertain what his plans are should thay be turned over to him at the Rayal Airport -namely, the number of guards that the Eherlif will have and other details Concerning the transportation of May from the airport to the Shelby County Jail after we have turned Ray over to the Sheriff at the airport, i.i ib ib .---REC-1 44-38361-

I indicated to the Attorney General that if the Air Force was going to send a plane from the United States to Great Britain to bring may back, the representatives of the Bureau who were to conduct May from Great Britain to the United States should be allowed to be over to Great Britain on the same plane that will be used for that purpose. The Attorney General indicated agreement with this suggestion.

At the time the Attorney General talked with me, I had not been advised of the actails worked out by Lr. I of the and her. Princip with assistant Attorney General Fred Vinson, but subsequent to the Attorney General's conference with me, a memorandum was received from Mr. Vinson setting forth the details which Mr. Vinson has worked out after consultation with Mr. Rosen and Mr. Minulch and I have sent this memorandum through with the indication that since representatives of the Bureau have aircady committed the Bureau to certain phases of the transportation of May, I was, consequently, bound by them; while I had not known of these committeents in advance and certainly would have made certain changes in them, I, nevertheless, would be bound by the commitments.

I think that in the future, it would be a great deal better for representatives of this cureau conferring with Departmental representatives to make no commitments of an important character without first submitting such commitments to me for approval. It is embarrassing to learn from Departmental sources of commitments, some of which I had never even heard about to fore.
