Anarchy, not police state

As I read the letters in The Sun-Times Wednesday about the recent killing of two Black Panthers, I am moved to wonder what kind of a society we have become, and whether we have the courage and common sense to endure.

To see and hear some portion of our people eulogizing vicious criminals like the Black Panthers is enough to give anyone pause. What masochists we have become! How twisted are our present values, that we can no longer differentiate between good and evil!

It seems to some of us that we are at present not so much in danger of becoming a police state as of becoming an anarchy. I, too, know what Nazi Germany was like. Although we are not Jews, I too lost members of my family to the Germans.

Contrary to what some of these writers say, it is not the lawful element in society — people like us — who are like Nazis. It is, so it seems to some of us, the Black Panthers, the SDS, the street gangs, the Mafia, the radicals of extreme hue of both left and right, who can be equated with Nazis and with the Gestapo.

All of those are dangerous criminals and anarchists who are devoted to the ideal, if one can use such a word in this context, of crushing us, of denying free speech and action to everyone but themselves and their ilk, and who now demand protection from the same laws they are dedicated to overthrow, for everyone but themselves.

Have we no sense of self-preservation left? Are we no longer on the side of God and good? Have we sold out to evil and the Devil? It seems that we have.

In years to come, if these violent dissident elements come into power, let us remember, if we are still alive, how a strong nation abrogated its responsibilities and blindly rushed into the arms of Satan. Then, when it is too late, we will understand who were Nazis and who were not.

Some of us understand that now. May God help those who do not, and who take the rest of us down into hell with them.

John Dillinger was shot down in front of a

theater in Chicago because he pulled a gun and threatened the lives of all those around him.

Bonnie and Clyde met a like fate. Hundreds of others who had illegal guns and were ready and able to use them have also been shot down, and no one condemned the police. The police were not required to walk into a murderous fire of bullets merely because those they were trying to arrest were around.

The argument here is that the Black Panthers is a political party, and that an effort is being made to eradicate them.

Let them put their principles and party planks before the people whose support they want like our other political parties do. Let them stop their illegal practice of hoarding guns and ammunition. Let them stop shooting at the police every time they are confronted by them. In short, let them stop acting like gangsters, and they will stop being treated as such.

Whatever happened to the principles of the great Martin Luther King Jr., who won great victories for his people, and who also won the respect of the world. He was respected by his friends and his enemies. I see the same type of respect for men like the Rev. Jesse Jackson and the Rev. Ralph Abernathy, who are blacks fighting for the welfare of their people.

Men like those are fighters, too; only they are fighting with the brains and guts that God gave them. If those men pulled guns and offered to shoot every time they were arrested, they would be dead and their names long forgotten.

A gunman is a dangerous animal regardless of his color or creed. Let us not honor them and eulogize them.

I don't know that much about the Black Panther Party. I have heard them called everything from Marxists to humanitarians; but whatever they are, if they are a political party, let's hear what they have to say without their guns.

Instead of buying a machinegun, buy a radio spot or hire a hall and let us hear you talk. It might not be a bad idea to hear a few debates between whites and blacks. But don't point a gun at another man be he white or black because he will go and get a gun, too. Let's all try to be what we are beneath the pigment of our skins — human beings.

Some questions, alternatives

Black Panther leader Fred Hampton was killed. Police who took part in the raid are being blamed and harassed for killing him. Let us look at this in a logical manner.

(1) Fred Hampton — leader of Black Panther Party, only occupation. Question: How did he earn a living?

(2) Police — Informed that illegal weapons are being stored in his apartment.

Alternatives: Police should ignore information. It's none of their business anyway.

Police should investigate and act on information.

Police should inform occupants of the building of the raid so that they can be prepared.

(3) Police choose second alternative. Arrive at Hampton's place. Announce that they have a search warrant. Police are greeted with a warm shower of gunfire.

Alternatives: Oh, I think I'll just stand here and let them shoot me.

Draw and fire.

(4) Those sympathetic towards Hampton's death: "The police killed him in cold blood."

(5) Thinking public: Police found an artillery of ammunition in Hampton's apartment. What thinking individual can honestly say to himself that Hampton and his friends were above using weapons — illegal weapons that they shouldn't have had in the first place.

I question Hampton and his associates' actual motives for keeping a room loaded with ammunition. Was it just decorative or did they plan to use it?

I question those who are immortalizing Hampton as a martyr for all black people. Why, how and on what basis?

Lastly, I am grateful to State's Atty. Edward V. Hanrahan and the police force for saving my life and that of many others.
