RACIAL TENSIONS rise after the Black Panther clashes. The FBI may get embroiled.

Even moderate Negroes, like Young of the Urban League, suspect a national plan to wipe out the Panthers. He sees a pattern of clashes involving the FBI as well as local police. The NAACP's Wilkins echoes the theme. Civil rights leaders don't expect satisfaction even if the Justice Department goes ahead with a requested investigation.
