Hearing Ends On Wiretap In Clay Case

HOUSTON, June 6 (AP)—A
Federal judge concluded a
wiretap hearing involving former heavyweight boxing
champion Cassius Clay today
but made no ruling.

U.S. Judge Joe Ingraham ordered lawyers to submit briefs.

The hearing, ordered by the Supreme Court, was to determine whether wiretaps had a bearing on the trial in which Clay was convicted of refusing to be inducted into the Army.

Among defense motions was one asking that Clay's conviction be set aside and that the case be remanded back to the Selective Service Board in Kentucky to determine if Clay should have conscientious objector status. The defense also asked to see more Government records.

Ingraham set no date on when he might rule on the motions.
