Judge Cites U.S. Lawyers in FBI Case

CHICAGO - A government attorney and an FBI agent have been cited for contempt for defying a agent have been cited for contempt for defying a court order to produce documents relating to al-leged political spying on thousands of Chicago area citizens. U.S. District Judge Alfred Y. Kirk-land signed the order yesterday, one day after he scolded Robert Rader, a Justice Department law-yer from Washington, and Robert Hamilton, a Washington FBI agent for "insulting . . , dis-graceful and outrageous" conduct. Rader had told Kirkland earlier that he wanted to show that guidelines enacted by Bell on domes-tic intelligence inquiries make moot the request

tic intelligence inquiries make moot the request for an injunction against further spying and he asked the judge to allow him to withhold certain documents.
