

Judge Cites U.S. Lawyers in FBI Case

CHICAGO — A government attorney and an FBI agent have been cited for contempt for defying a court order to produce documents relating to alleged political spying on thousands of Chicago area citizens. U.S. District Judge Alfred Y. Kirkland signed the order yesterday, one day after he scolded Robert Rader, a Justice Department lawyer from Washington, and Robert Hamilton, a Washington FBI agent for "insulting . . . disgraceful and outrageous" conduct.

Rader had told Kirkland earlier that he wanted to show that guidelines enacted by Bell on domestic intelligence inquiries make moot the request for an injunction against further spying and he asked the judge to allow him to withhold certain documents.
