

FBI Watched Doctor for 27 Years

CHICAGO — The chief of medicine at Cook County Hospital says he was aware that FBI agents had been watching him, but was stunned to see a report of the extent of the surveillance.

The Chicago Daily News reported yesterday that the FBI surveillance began in 1948 when Dr. Quentin Young was graduated from Northwestern University medical school, and continued at least until 1975.

"I certainly knew we were being scrutinized," Young said. "But I never realized the enormity of the invasion of privacy, and the waste of time, personnel and money."

Young, 54, was involved in the civil rights and anti-Vietnam War movements.
