

This report indicates why Division files in HQ must be searched in cases like JFK and MLK. While the FBI may well have considered that there were domestic intelligence aspect requiring investigation at the time of the assassination, since then it is apparent there were none turned up and there thus would appear to be no need to withhold. 89-43-2044.

No worksheet entry near here seems like to have been this "security" report. I recall none from past.

## Memorandum

SUBJECT: ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

DATE: 12/3/63

There were placed on American Airlines Flight 690, departing Love Field, 11:55 PM, 12/2/63, arriving Washington, D. C., National Airport, 4:10 AM, 12/3/63, 4 packages for the Bureau. These packages were placed in the care and custody of Capt. CULLEN ROWE. Arrangements were made through Operations Manager M. MARBERRY. These packages were taken to the airport and placed on Flight 690 by SA PAUL E. WULFF, who personally observed the plane take off from Love Field.

The four packages consisted of the following:

1. One small package, 4"x4", directed to the attention of Assistant Director CONRAD, which contained film.
2. One package containing shells obtained from the firing range, Dallas County. This package was directed to the attention of Mr. ROSEN.
3. The two remaining packages were large in size and contained security aspects of the 89-43 investigation. (Reports)

Upon being advised by SA WULFF that the flight was airborne, the writer telephonically advised the Bureau, Domestic Intelligence Div., Supv. J. HAROLD GLASCOCK, of the above described packages. Supv. GLASCOCK advised that an Agent would meet the plane.

Thereafter, the writer requested that he be switched over to the General Investigative Div., at which time, Supv. DONALD J. MC NERNEY was also advised of the packages being sent to the Bu. Further, Supv. MC NERNEY was informed that Inspector JAMES R. MALLEY desired that his division (Division VI) obtain from the Domestic Intelligence Div. a copy of the security report in DL file 89-43.
