ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

ASAC CLARK: USA sent assistant over and wants him in on all conferences. He advised the Attorney General has so instructed.

Mr. BELMONT: We will keep the U. S. Attorney's office advised of developments as we do in any other case, and we will make a report at the appropriate time, and if there is a question of a legal matter to be decided, we will consult immediately with the U. S. Attorney's office, but the investigation of this matter is in our hands and we will conduct the investigation. We do not consider it desirable or necessary for the U. S. Attorney's Assistant to be sitting in on the investigative aspects of sitting in your front office.

ASAC CLARK: I want you to know they are sending down the Chief of the Criminal Division, JACK MILLER.

Mr. BELMONT: MILLER is a good man and a reasonable man. If they are sending him, it is for consultation on legal matters, etc. We should consult with him on any legal matters. I reiterate, the investigative aspects of this rest with the Bureau and are being carried out to the fullest extent of our ability and we will handle that.

ASAC CLARK: We are sending a film which shows RUBY shooting OSWALD from two different angles. The news people are holding the original film in case it may be needed. They will not release it to anybody. The film will be in hands of Captain on Braniff Flight 110, arrival National, 7:30 p.m. your time.

Mr. BELMONT: Send film through normal means. Do not send an Agent. RUBY left Chicago to avoid the underworld.
