LEE HARVEY OSWALD INTERNAL SECURITY - RUSSIA

Re momorandum dated 12/5/63 to Mr. Sullivan from Mr. Branigan advising a letter had been intercepted by Secret Service. This letter was addressed to Lee Harvey Oswald, "Mail Office," Dallas, Texas, postmarked LaHabana, Cuba, November 28. The letter is dated in the Laboratory 10, 1963. The letter and envelope were received written in Spanish, contains the typewritten signature "Pedro Charles" and the handwritten signature "Pedro." It is conspiratorial in content and <u>implies</u> a prior conspiracy between the writer and Harvey Oswald to assassinate the President.

A second letter was received in the Laboratory on 12/9/63, Attorney General. This second letter was addressed to the Attorney General in Washington, D. C., was dated at Havana 11/27/63, and postmarked on the reverse side 11/28/63, 9:30 A.M. This letter was written in Spanish, bore the handwritten signature "Mario dol the President, denounces Pedro Charles as an agent of Fidel Castro and alleges payment of \$7000 to Oswald to assassinate the President. It was concluded that both letters and envelopes were prepared on the same typewriter. This typewriter is an interval of the president.

on the same typewriter. This typewriter is equipped with Remington Number 10 large pica type, first used on standard correspondence. machines in October 1935. This typewriting was not identified in the Anonymous Letter File or in the National Security File.

It was concluded that both of the envelopes came from the same source. These envelopes have a yellowish tinge indicating they are from an old batch. It was noted that the postmark on the reverse sides of both envelopes is the same and that the "9:30 A.M." portion of the postmark is upside down on both envelopes. Furthermore, both envelopes have an illegible postmark on the faces of the envelopes, for which only the "1963" is legible. Furthermore, the same kind of three-cent stamp was found on both envelopes.

The second letter was typed on a sheet of bond paper which is .0042 inches thick, whereas the first letter is on a thin manifold paper which is .0020 inches thick. Both sheets of paper are similar in length and width. It was concluded that both envelopes had been previously opened and resealed.

previously opened and resealed. It was found that the same type pen and ink was used to sign both letters.

No indented handwriting or microdots were found on the letters and envelopes.

No latent prints of value were found on the envelopes and letters.

The paper comprising the letters and envelopes did not contain any watermarks or other significant characteristics which would indicate the source of the paper.

Photographs of both envelopes and letters and copies of the translations from the Spanish are attached. The original evidence is temporarily retained in the Laboratory.

A Laboratory report will be promptly forwarded to the Dallas Office.

ACTION: The above information has been discussed telephonically with Domestic Intelligence Division and is set forth for inclusion in any over-all evaluation of these letters.

DDENDUM:

The handwritten signatures are extremely limited and are more not comparable; therefore, it is not possible to determine , whether they were written by the same person.
