ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY

LEA EUINS, 411 Avenue F, advised that on the day of the assassination, he was standing on the northeast corner of the intersection of Elm and Houston Streets. He stated that the car in which the President was riding had turned the corner and was proceeding on down Elm. He stated since he could no longer see the President's car, he happened to glance up and noticed what appeared to be the barrellof a rifle protruding from the window near the top of the Texas School Book Depository Building. He stated he saw a man's hand on what appeared to be the rifle stock and that he knew it was a rifle because he heard the shots fired. He stated he could not tell anything about the man and that he never saw anything other than what appeared to be his hand on the stock.

JOHN EDDIE JONES, stepfather of AMOS LEE EUINS, advised that the boy had told him he had seen the above, but that he was not sure whether EUINS had seen it, or whether he had just imagined it. He could add nothing to what EUINS related.
