Sylvia "eagher's incomplete published index has β more than 60 witnesses testifying to what she calls "misreporting" by the FBI. Of this a good-sized percentage is Dallas police of varying rank.

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There are, of course, more instances of this testimony than there are witnesses who so testified.

Under [FBI] "Reports withheld from Exhibits 44 witnesses are cited.

If it is assumed that the WC testimonyp provides definitive answers Gallagher did not testify to and was not asked to testify to anything aside from the paraffin casts.

"rom Sylvia's exhibit Hencliffe was not asked about the curing off of the clothing. Carrico testified to it twice, volunteering the testimony, but was not questioned about it. Bowron's testimony should be checked.

The point is that the testimony is not dependable as used in the decision or order. Even if completely cited, as I believe is not likely.

But a check of Humes testimony 2H365-5 has him testifying that the holes in the back of the shirt is 6 inches down, which is not where the government says it was on the body, and does not have him asked about of testifying to whether or not the damage to the shirt collar is represented by coinciding holes.

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
