

The Dallas F.O. copy of the L.A. 3/20/68 record, Dallas 89-43-8161 shows that L.A. sent Dallas a separate registered copy for the Dallas Roger Craig file and a registered copy to New Orleans for its Garrison file. Eight other files are indicated. All these and the Garrison and Craig files are 100s. Of the eight four are indicated as "DEAD." At least three of these are known as critics of the Warren Commission. (I do not know the fourth, Jerry Lucas.) The three are Penn Jones, Steve Jaffe and Steve Burton.

They opened a new 100 file for (LALYNN) (phonetic). In context this has to be the late Lillian Castellano. She alone also as Lalyon, is indicated to be indexed. This would seem to indicate that LA already had the others indexed.

Unless an unaccounted copy is made for indexing, only 11 of the 12 indicated copies is accounted for. (One appears to be the informer's file.)

Penn Jones was the speaker at a 2/29/68 off-campus meeting at UCLA. Craig also spoke.

Alongside the list of files at the bottom there is a horizontal mark ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ opposite the "dead" file entries only.

It appears that the FBI has 100 files on critics.

Under "Internal Security."

Can "dead" be the reason so little was provided by Dallas and LA in response to my PA requests?

No other such records are in the Dallas records provided, as best I can recall. Yet Dallas appears to have filed copies of the 100 records in the 89-43 file. It appears that L.A. sent Dallas a copy for the Roger Craig file only and that none were sent to FBIHQ.
