

## FBI Chief Urges Continuation Of Watch Against Terrorism

FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley called yesterday for continuing the same vigilance that he said helped prevent well-publicized terrorists threats from materializing during the bicentennial year.

Kelley said that "by no means is terrorism rampant in this country—fatalities may be declining." But he added:

"We have compelling reason for law enforcement, in partnership with the public, to remain vigilant. In addition to your home-grown terrorists, we Americans are reluctant hosts to small, warring alien factions who seem quite willing to turn areas of our country into staging areas for violence elsewhere or battlegrounds for slaughter here."

Kelley said that considering terrorists activity on a nationwide basis,

some may say the problem is not serious, "but how do you tell that the the loved ones of the murder victims, or persons who have been maimed by terrorists."

The FBI director's year-end report cited Miami as an example, with reportedly more than 100 bombings there in the past 2½ years. Also, he said, there have been at least five assassinations and numerous attempts involving serious injury.

Kelley quoted testimony released last August by a Senate subcommittee that as many as 50 militant Cuban groups—pro-Castro and anti-Castro—have been operating in Miami at one time.

He said bombing targets in Miami have included the FBI's office, the Dade County police department, the state attorney's office and Miami International Airport.
