

FBI Data Sought

NASHVILLE — Tennessean publisher John Seigenthaler and three of his staff members have demanded to inspect their FBI files.

The demand, filed last weekend with Justice Department officials, stems

from an earlier disclosure that the FBI had questioned a former Tennessean copy editor, Jacque Srouji, about at least two of the paper's employees.

Srouji was fired by Seigenthaler following disclosure of her "special relationship" with the FBI.

William R. Willis, general counsel for the Tennessean, said the demand was filed on behalf of Seigenthaler, and declined to identify the three staff members.

Time magazine identified the two staffers about whom Srouji was questioned as Dolf Honicker and Jerry Hornsby, who work on the newspaper's copy deck.
