Havoid Weisberg, author of the book, "Whitewash," which is a controversial study of the assassination of President Hennedy and the Warren Commission Report, was interviewed by Bob Raiford on WICP Radio at 2:10 p.m. tdday.

I have found, given how capricious some of these deletions are, that I can win minor victories. And, I do want to create a record outlining the basis for my challegge--a record which will have no bearing on any future litigation but which might prove of interest to congressional oversight committees.

Because I have not read the documents you sent on to me, I cannot express fully my appreciation for your willingness not only to select the documents but to provide the detailed background report. I am confident that I shall find that extremely helpful, and thus (if sight unseen) I have no hesitation to express my gratitude for this yeoman effort.

Let me remind you to send me an itemized bill for xerox charges and mailing costs. I shall remit this bill, providing a record of the expenditure, to the University for processing a check against the funds I have to defray processing charges for FBI files. The University is pretty efficient, and I can promise that you will receive a check within 10 days after I receive your bill.

Let me conclude by thanking you again. Work on the biography continues and I have every intention of meeting the fall 1985 submission deadline.
