Warren report repped

WASHINGTON (AP) — The author of several books criticizing the official investigation of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy says he has evidence that the Warren Commission prejudged the case.

In a new book published Saturday, Harold Weisberg released a proposed outline of the Warren Commission report which he said established that "the conclusion was determined before the investigation began."

Weisberg said the outline was submitted to the commission headed by then-Chief Justice Earl Warren in January

1961, before the panel began its investigation.

Weisberg said the outline included the assumption that Lee Harvey Oswald was the assassin.
