On 12/11/63 SA JAMES W. BOOKHOUT advised that items set forth in referenced communication were forwarded to the Bureau on 12/10/63. SA BOOKHOUT advised that the initials "RMS" on back of Dallas Transit Company Shoppers Transfer dated Friday, 11/22/63 are those of Detective RICHARD M. SIMS, Homicide Division, Dallas Police Department.

A review of the report of SA ROBERT P. GEMBERLING dated 11/30/63 at Dallas, reflects that on 11/22/63 SAs BARDWELL D. ODUM and ALFRED C. ELLINGTON interviewed Cecil J. MC WATTERS, 2523 Blyth Street, Dallas, bus driver, Dallas Transit Company, who advised that "while he was at the Dallas Police Department on 11/22/63 he was shown a Dallas Transit Transfer which he identified as having been issued by him on 11/22/63, on the run which he has described as being at St. Paul and Elm at 12:36 P.M. He stated that all transfers issued on this run from north to south showed a time of 1:00 P.M. and 1:00 P.M. was shown on the transfer exhibited to him at the police department. He further stated that he recognized the marks of his ticket punch on this transfer he examined in the 'P.M.' box and in the 'Lakewood' box. He stated this transfer was dated 11/22/63."

In view of the above no further investigation is being conducted as pertains to lead #1.

On 12/10/63 Captain J. W. FRITZ, Homicide and Robbery Bureau, Dallas PD, released to the FBI the hereinafter described personal property of LEE HARVEY OSWALD, which was taken from OSWALD at the time of his arrest on 11/22/63:

1, \$13.00 in currency consisting of one \$5.00 bill and eight \$1.00 bills;

- 87¢ consisting of one fifty cents piece; three dimes; one nickle, two pennies;
- 3. Dallas Transit Company Shoppers Transfer dated Friday, November 22, 1963, bearing number 004459, perforated "P M," and also perforated "Lake Wood," bearing the initials on the back, "RMS;"
- 4. Paycheck stub from American Bakeries Company dated August 22, 1960, or August 27, 1960, reflecting amount of pay as \$66.17, less Federal income tax \$7.40, less Social Security \$1.99, reflecting net amount of check as \$56.78;
- 5. One narrow, black belt with buckle;
- 6. Small box top bearing the name "Cox's, Fort Worth;"
- Brass key marked, "P. O. Dept. Do Not Dup.", Number 1126;
- 8. Silver color Marine Corps emblem ring;
- 9. Chrome ID bracelet with expansion band with inscription "Lee."

In connection with the box top bearing the name "Cox's, Fort Worth": Cox's, Fort Worth, Texas, should be contacted to determine if LEE HARVEY OSWALD had account at this store and, if possible, determine what connection this item could have with LEE HARVEY OSWALD.

No. 4

Contact USPO for information concerning the brass Post Office key, Number 1126. (This probably is key to P. O. Box known to have been rented by LEE HARVEY OSWALD.)

No. 5

It is noted that the serial numbers of the currency mentioned above have been furnished FBI Lab for checking through National Stolen Property File.

Consideration should be given to forwarding the rest of the above-listed items to the FBI Lab for appropriate examination.

(3) Upon receipt of the photograph from the FBI Laboratory, will contact proper official at Dallas Police Department to get Dallas Police Department inventory corrected, with respect to item 375 to read as a one Minox light meter rather than one Minox camera.

(4) If it is determined that OSWALD may have had a Russian made camera, while in Russia, a lead should be set forth for U. S. Customs at New York to endeavor to check at that location to determine if OSWALD when he returned to the United States From Russia, in June, 1962, declared such a camera.
