I have told you that the FBI requires that permission be asked to destroy records, even duplicates, and that I have seen many instances of requests being made, permission granted or denied, and destruction, where approved, accounted for to FBIHQ. When I went over those records I did not have the need for copies so I did not make subject-file copies of them.

In the Merico City marine records provided by Bud (and to him) and that are really copies of FEIHQ 105-82555 there are records reflecting this FEI requirement. (First number FEIHQ, second HC 105-3702.)

Horico City had a file drawer of duplicates of large reports it did not originate. It wanted that space, so it listed each and every report it wanted to destroy and asked for permission, in writing, explaining its reason. When permission was granted by FBIHQ, the explanatory note added at FBIHQ to the short airtel to MC is longer than the text of the airtel. Then, after receiving permission, MC reported in writing that it had destroyed those unneeded copies and how they were destroyed.

Mexico City knew that these reports existed at FEIHQ, Dallas and New Orleans, at the very least, and t at it had no need for any copies, yetbit still requested permission to destroy and provided a persuasive reason.
