eles office to just a regular FBI agent assigned to Minneapolis. His salary dropped accordingly, from \$36,000 a year

to \$24,362. David L. Binley, crecutive assistant to acting TBI Direc-tor L. Patrick Gray III, con-firmed that Grap had been demoted and suspended a second time.

The first time, he was suspended for 25 days and trans-ferred to El Paso as special agent in charge. The second suspension cost him 30 days and bounced him to Minneapolis.

lis. Grapp's second demotion and transfer occurred when inspectors confirmed that Grapp was monitoring tele-phone conversations in his Los Angeles office.
