In case you do not read the story from which I'll quote in this morning's Post or do not see what I do if you do read it, let me quote this from the deaction of Washington Field Office AIC Kunkel:

"After a brief period in charge of the FBI's Memphis field office he was transferred to the same job in Washington in July 1970."

Regardless of how "brief" this period was, it does mean that Jenson did not remain AIC in Memphis for long after his testimony in the May mini-trial.

This does not necessarily have to have any significance for us. However, I also do not think we should assume that it can't or that it doesn't, and I think we should be alert to the reasons. Perhaps when you are in touch with Bob he may have heard something about that at the time or since. If so, I'd be interested.

I find it a rather interesting commentary on Gray that in the same story a formal release announcing the shift of personnel between Washington and the field he refers to ~~as~~ all his AICs as "field commanders".
