Farrington. A copy of the memorandum was addressed to Mr. Wilderotter and the memorandum indicated that we would make available to Wilderotter for his review, but not for retention, a copy of the inventory of the documents. At 2:30 p.m. on July 1, 1975, I met with Mr. Wilderotler in his office at the White House and furnished him his copy of the memorandum and a copy of the inventory. I asked Mr. Wilderotter to review it carefully and if he desired to indicate appropriate disposition of the items listed. Mr. Wilderotter reviewed each of the items and indicated for each recommendations as to their disposition. He placed an X or wrole the word "burn" beside those he thought should be destroyed. Others he indicate the recipients to whom the materials should be forwarded. 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


