If you've wondered why the FBI refused to perform the tests urged by the AAC or why the FBI has not come up with any real reports on the scientific testing we've been using for Little Rock has confirmed by earlier answer.

FBI sent a teletype on 12/12/63 that told the field offices not to investigate the crime but to continue to investigate reports about the elected lone assassin.

The crime was solved "conclusively," the SAC, Little Rock told his SAC.

Only the directive not to investigate the crime is new to me, and it is about as explicit as I'd ever expect anyone in the FBI to put on paper: "investigation... restricted to him..." and any connection but not with the shooting. They might give it another interpretation for public consumption but in context I don't, not when it begins by saying ~~the~~ Oswald has been conclusively established as assassin.

Even then no instructions to go out and dig. Only to check information.

With the only part, however, there is itemized a list of questions to be investigated.

This is Little Rock 100-406-39.

On March 11, 1964 the same SAC told his agents what is important when they investigate a Presidential assassination, as FBI has communicated it: spelling. (What I've seen is better than mine, I'm sure Lil would agree.)

FBI's awareness that this was an historical case is stated in the first para quoted from PHIA: "...creating a historical records ..."

So I wonder why the AAC had to make this finding more than a decade later, only to not have the FBI treat the case and processing under it as historical?

If you read this stuff carefully it is virtually self-caricature: you don't investigate the crime but you do put the best spellers and those with best pen and of sentence structure in writing the reports.

It also appears that the work is funny cartoons, illegible cursive and as I've heard often enough, missing pages.

Did they catch Billinger or did he catch them?


SUBJECT: LEE HARVEY OSWALD

The Bureau by Airtel dated 3/10/64 instructed that the following be brought to the immediate attention of all personnel who are concerned:

"It is necessary at this time with this communication to call to the attention of all offices the need for meticulous reporting in this investigation. You should know that reports and letterhead memoranda submitted by the offices covering investigation in their respective jurisdictions are furnished to the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy. This Commission is engaged in the task of creating a historical record and, consequently, could be most critical of loose investigation and loose reporting. Our investigative efforts are judged by our reports. Therefore, each SAC should insure that due care and consideration are given to this matter.

"Bureau recognizes that some SAs excel over others in reporting results of investigations. In this instance, we want to insure that we utilize our best investigators and our best report writers. This will include careful proofreading before submission of a report or letterhead memorandum. Bureau is dealing with this case as a "Special" and we do not want to lose valuable time by having to return reports and letterhead memoranda because of incorrect spelling, sentence structure and other obvious inadequacies. At the same time, you should insure in this investigation and others being disseminated to the Commission that we do not have fuzzy carbon copies, illegible mimeographs, missing pages, etc."
