Aside from the Hoover testimony I earlier cited on this point, which beers on the interpretation of the Bevine letter and the Department of Justice suppression of its knowledge that Oswald used the 544 Camp St address and the significance thereof, in examining the NBC book, "There Was a President" (re: Tarsikes), I find that at 10:05 p.m. Sunday night, 11/24/63 (page 119, bottom), where Sandar Vanocur quotes the DJ as saying the case is not closed and it will not allow the Dallas policemto close it.

In short, I think that what evidence exists is to the effect that whether or not it is saying enything, whether or not the official pose is that the Warren Report is definitive, the government actually has a continuing investigation, and that it is under this cover that its intrusions have been carried on, that it is withholding what it does not now want known, finds justification for FBI interviews of people, etc.

Once Oswald was murdered, did it really dere take any other position? I think not, regardless of how little is said.
