

Kelley Promotes 2 Others

McDermott Gets No. 3 FBI Post

The FBI announced yesterday the appointment of John J. McDermott as acting assistant to the director and deputy associate director for administration.

A statement issued by FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley said McDermott, 50, will succeed Thomas J. Jenkins in the post, making him the bureau's third-ranking official. Jenkins retired last month.

McDermott had been serving as an assistant director, in charge of the files and communications division.

Kelley's statement also announced two other promotions—Richard E. Long to be acting assistant director for finance and personnel and Charles A. Donelan to acting assistant director in charge of the training division.

Long, 48, has been special agent in charge of the office in Phoenix, Ariz.

He succeeds Eugene W. Walsh, who retired last month.

Donelan, 58, was moved up from his previous post as inspector in the office of legal counsel. He takes over supervision of the training division from William M. Mooney, who also retired.
