

## Reuss Scores FBI Files 'On Millions' of Innocent

TOKYO, April 12 (AP) — Rep. Henry Reuss (D-Wis.) said today the FBI has no business compiling dossiers "on millions of Americans"—including his daughter—"who are accused of no wrongdoing."

Reuss said an FBI representative visited him in mid-March in his office in Washington and told him three FBI documents concerning his daughter, Jackie, had been stolen from the FBI office in Media, Pa., in early March and might be made public.

Reuss said the FBI agency told him the papers indicated that Swarthmore college, where Miss Reuss is a student, local police and a local credit

bureau had been checked concerning certain information about his daughter given the FBI by an informer.

"The FBI representative informed me the investigation had been completed and had developed that no information of derogatory nature concerning Jackie had been uncovered," he said.

"The FBI has an important responsibility to investigate crime. Its mission is not to compile dossiers on millions of Americans, congressmen's daughters or not, who are accused of no wrongdoing. They should stick to their mission."

Reuss is in the Far East for an economic conference.
