FBI Manual Stolen in Pa. Sent to Paper

"The Citizens Commission to Investigate the FBI" has surfaced for the first time since last spring with another set of documents stolen from the Media, Pa., office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The documents received by The Washington Post in the mail yesterday make up a handbook for Philadelphia FBI agents on use of the National Crime Information Center, a computerized system that provides instant information on fugitives and stolen property.

Earlier documents have focused on FBI surveillance of black organizations in the Philadelphia area.

In a covering memo with the new documents, the committee disputed the origins of NCIC, saying it had been in operation for two years.
