FBI Seizes Duplicates of Data in Pa.

PHILADELPHIA, May 17— FBI agents with a warrant to search for documents stolen from the Bureau's Media, Pa., office raided the West Philadelphia apartment Sunday of an employee of the American Friends Service Committee.

Anne Flitcraft, 22, said she was upstairs in a friend's apartment when she heard noises at her own door.

"I looked over the balcony and there was a crowd of men with a sledge hammer opening my door. When I got downstairs they were inside," she said. "They knocked the door off its hinges."

She said at least eight agents took her typewriter, personal papers, books and about 30 copies of stolen docucase.

ments. She said the duplicated documents had been sent anonymously to her employer about two months ago and were to be used in a supplement to a Service Committee pamphlet.

Miss Fliteraft's apartment is located in Powelton Village, a section in the city that is populated primarily with young adults and University of Pennsylvania students.

Joe D. Jamieson, special agent in charge of the Philadelphia office, said, "We executed a duly authorized search warrant in a lawful manner. I have no further comment."
