Charges False Says Robinson

NEW YORK, June 28 (AP) — Jackie Robinson, cited by columnist Jack Anderson Tuesday as being on a Secret Service list of persons posing potential threats to the President, said today that the FBI and the Department of Justice have assured him that the report is untrue.

Robinson quoted acting FBI Director Patrick L. Gray and Atty. Gen. Richard Kleindienst as terming Anderson's allegation, intended to ridicule the alleged list, as "a lot of bull."

Robinson said he had appeared at a White House gate three years ago with 15 or 20 other small businessmen to ask for a meeting with President Nixon on the matter of black capitalism and that everyone who sought a presidential meeting there is "dhehked out" by the Secret Service.
