John P. Mohr, the No. 3 man in the Federal Bureau of Investigation, submitted his resignation yesterday — the fourth top official of the bureau to quit since the death May 2 of J. Edgar Hoover.

Mohr, 62, one of two assistants to acting Director L. Patrick Gray III, said he would step down June 30 "for personal reasons" after nearly 40

there were widespread reports that many of the top men in the bureau were considering a mass resignation. But all stayed except for Associate Director Clyde Tolson, Hoover's closest companion who announced his retirement at age 72 the day Hoover was buried.

Then, on May 10, Alex Rosen, 66, the other assistant to the director, resigned effective May 31 and Joseph J. Casper, head of the FBI training division, announced June 1 that he was quitting at the end of the month.
