FBI Director Justifies Raid **On Alexandria Apartment**

FBI Director Clarence M. Kelley released an eight-page justification yesterday for the bureau's 'forced entry March 15 into an Alexandria apartment in a futile hunt for fugitive newspaper heiress Patricia Hearst.

The decision to break in was made, the statement says, because of the "definite air of authenticity" of the anonymous tip that led the FBI to the apartment.

In addition, the FBI said, "reasonable ... efforts to question the occupant(s) of the apartment had been repelled," and the Symbionese Libera- / tion Army, which Miss Hearst has said she joined, has "a virtual suicidal compulsion toward violence."
