Student Photographs Hijacker, Evades FBI

WASHINGTON (AP) — Roger Buchanan had to brave a gauntlet of angry passengers to photograph the hijacker of a TWA jetliner, then had to evade FBI agents to get his film to the public, he said.

Buchanan's picture of armed hijacker Arthur Barkley in the cockpit of the plane was transmitted early today by The Associated Press.

Buchanan, 29, a fine arts student at Arizona State University, said stewardesses and passengers heatedly argued he was endangering them when he moved forward in the plane to photograph. He said he was shoved and his view was blocked several times.

"I just told them it was

my thing and I had to do it," he said.

After he jumped from the plane at Dulles airport and was photographing from the outside, another passenger slapped him, Buchanan said.

Government officers herded passengers from the hijacked plane into an airport room for questioning. Buchanan said he was sure his film would be impounded, so he told FBI agents he had to go to the men's room.

Two agents accompanied him, but when reporters surrounded him, Buchanan said he broke free from the agents, found a relative who had come to meet him and drove off from the airport to The AP's Washington bureau.
