

• The "Baby Lenore" bill allowing a mother only 30 days to change her mind after giving up a child for adoption has been signed by New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller.

• Federal officials have ordered the execution of all the ducks at the Palace of Fine Arts pond in San Francisco because they may have a rare European disease brought in by tourists.

• William Seldon Myrick, arrested by FBI agents in Chattanooga, Tenn., on a charge that he deserted from the U.S. Army, has filed a petition in federal court seeking his release from jail on the grounds that he has never been in the Army.

• The Greater New Orleans AFL-CIO says it put New Orleans Mayor Moon Landrieu on its "unfair to labor list." Landrieu countered, putting the AFL-CIO on the "unfair to mayors list."

• Chefs in peaked caps, cocktail waitresses in skimpy outfits and bellboys in uniforms walked through midtown New York streets when the city's 25,000 hotel workers staged a four-hour walkout to back demands for higher wages. Guests at 140 hotels had to tote their own luggage.
