Under date of December 22, 1976, I addressed a letter to you in which I identified myself as the wife of Harold Weisberg to whom you had furnished certain documents.

In my letter I asked under FOIPA for the release of the full and unexpurgated document which had been withheld from him because it related to me and for any and all other references to me.

As of this date I have received no reply. I would like to know why my request has been ignored. Time limits for response are established under the Acts.

My husband asks me also to remind you that State has not yet provided all the records on or relating to bin: that he now has added proof of this; that the time for response to an appeal is long since past; that he has beard nothing about his desire to correct these records under his Privacy Act rights; and that State is leaving us littler alternative to litigation, an action we both hope you as well as we would want to avoid.
